Your Participation in the Community

What you can expect when you participate in the community is to have open, honest, and supportive discussions. Be honest and transparent. As a member of the Community, you will be participating as yourself, not anonymously, or with a pseudonym. Please use your first name (or chosen name) and last name when creating your profile. We ask that you to represent yourself authentically so you can forge genuine relationships with your fellow community members.

Think before you post: Before you post anything, please think about how it may be perceived. Remember that you are introducing yourself for the first time to your fellow classmates and partners and there is no “undo” button.

In addition, you are legally responsible for any content you post and you may be subject to liability if your posts are found defamatory or harassing.

Always respect community members: Please do not use ethnic slurs, personal insults, or obscenity. Do not engage in personal attacks or disparage any other participant in this community.

Do not share confidential information While we intend this community to be open and transparent, it is not an appropriate forum for sharing confidential information.

Get involved, but do not spam: We encourage sharing information with each other, but the community is primarily a place for socializing, networking, and support, not a place for direct promotion or selling. We will monitor the community in order to help keep it a trusted and useful environment, free of self-promotion and spam.
